He has received honorable mentions and awards for distinction in important competitions such as the Nami Island International Picture Book Illustration Competition, the 3X3 (Contemporary Illustration Magazine) Illustration Competition, the Sharjah Reading Festival Illustration Competition, the Asia Reading Festival Illustration Competition, and the Bologna Children's Book Fair. In 2021, he was nominated for the ALMA (Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award) by IBBY Turkey. His first book, *Kuşbaz* (2024), which he both wrote and illustrated, was published by Redhouse Kidz.

She continues to host a podcast called "Çocuklar Kitaplar Ejderhalar" (Children's Books Dragons) alongside writers who share her sensitivity to children's literature, aiming to give it the value it deserves and to understand the power of children's books better.

Sezen Aksu Taşyürek was born in 1989 in Eskişehir. After graduating from Eskişehir Anatolian Fine Arts High School Painting Department, she completed her degree from Dumlupinar University, Faculty of Fine Arts, Department of Cartoon-Animation. Since 2013, she has been writing and illustrating children's books, as well as creating illustrations for magazines, newspapers, and other publications. Her books "Do Monsters Come at Night?" (Canavarlar Gece Gelir mi?) and "Where is My Home?" (Benim Evim Nerede?), which she both wrote and illustrated, were published in 2017. "Pera's Giant Chest" (Pera'nın Dev Sandığı) was published in 2022. The artist lives in Istanbul.

After a buzz, my friend Defne's voice came in scratchy from her vantage point on the balcony:

"I read you, Agent Jumping Mullet! Target in sight. Moving to phase one of Operation Tailless Lizard! Stand by!"

The villa's terrace was a secret corner where writers sipped coffee and daydreamed. Nonna, my grandmother Beatrice Baltazzi della Seta, had turned her home into a writer's retreat years ago. For as long as I can remember, this place we called the Wild Thyme Villa was filled with the sound of typewriters, the click of keyboards, and the rustle of pages.

Honestly, what they wrote didn't matter to me at all. They wore ordinary clothes, gossiped about new authors, and would be ecstatic if they wrote two thousand words a day. In fact, the only interesting thing about them was that they were perfect for the spy game my friend Defne and I played.

I grinned and raised my binoculars to my eyes, scanning the French writer lounging on a chaise longue on the terrace, then the young Italian poet sitting in the shade of the fig tree, and then the Swedish journalist rehearsing aloud the article she had so excitedly written in the gazebo. In our eyes, they were all potential 'secret agents'. Each of them was part of our game.

But the most important of them all was the Professor.

Born in 1979 in Istanbul, Delal Arya spent her childhood traveling on her father's ship, as he was a captain. By the time she was nine, she began turning her time spent on the ship into adventure stories. After graduating from the Italian High School, she pursued studies in Cinema-Television and Archaeology. Mythology and history became the two most prominent elements in her writing. Delal Arya, who writes historical books blended with mythological and fantastical elements, has published works including the *Pera Diaries* series, *the Seven Seas* series, *Mysterious City Elevators*, and the *From Beyond* series.
