Kaja Meyer's book debut begins quietly and almost inconspicuously: the main character Worm is having breakfast in the dining room while a new day begins outside his window. But internally, he is plagued by a nameless pain for which even the sky knows no answer. Thus, Wurm embarks on a journey that will bring more questions than certainties, more opaqueness than clarity.

Inspired by the worm that is briefly mentioned as a symbol for suffering in Franz Schubert's song cycle "Winterreise" from 1827, Kaja Meyer examines the emotional landscapes that are not easy to grasp but can be shaped graphically. With stylistic variety and atmospheric abstraction, "Was drängst Du denn so wunderlich, mein Herz?" finds images in the face of existential uncertainty that float across the page like the sets of a theater piece while at the same time inviting readers to get lost in every detail.




VON SPATZ



After the sudden suicide of their father, two siblings begin a silent correspondence: she writes to him, he sends drawings back. Each filled page makes visible what words often lack. In verses and colourful illustrations Julia Kluge goes on a hunt for centuries-old hunting customs. The close connection of hunting with the development of culture and art goes back to the Paleolithic cave paintings, and since then each epoch had found its own depiction of hunting between necessary food acquisition, mystic ritual, and brutal pastime.

In remembrance of the excellently decorated historical hunting books from the 18th century, Julia Kluge drew her own "wise quide". Her illustrations open a view on a cultural heritage hidden in the undergrowth, referring to the tips, tricks and the technique of the hunting in scurrily beautiful manner. The ink drawing's fine structures are reminiscent of light, which falls through the thick tree tops on the forest floor. Crisp verses attack the once secret language of the huntsmen. The result is a book to be enjoyed with a wink that reflects the ambivalent relationship between the proud self-image of the hunters and the hunted animals.




















LANGFINGER & WACKELZAHN

Langfinger is a teenager, orphan, and self-appointed master thief. He lives in a vacant factory building near a forest with his dog Wackelzahn. Together with Max, whose parents are about to get divorced, and his stone toad Gunter they roam through fallow industrial areas, adjacent fields and forests, throw stones at people, and destroy the territory of the warring gang "Logbuch-Eiche".

In his Coming-of-Age-Story Michel Esselbrügge manages to shape a sociocritical image of adolescent life forms without moralizing. His characters act in a childish world of imagination, consisting of superpowers, banditry and destructive "angry-youth" outcasts. They are looking for affiliation to construct any kind of identity, but they neither become mature nor adult.



LICHTPAUSE tells a day in Algiers, from the early morning to the night, and takes us on a long walk through the city. The voice of the narrator mixes with the voices of her friends who comment, interpret, ask, answer. It is about the air, the traffic, the sea, the presence of violence, the money, the oil, the layers of the past that are deposited in the architecture. About the view of the Europeans on Algiers and about the possibility of friendship, despite the echoes of the history and the current situation.

The book was created during two stays of the artist in Algiers, between September 2016 and April 2017. The work on the text and drawings was mainly an occasion to listen, to observe, to find a look that is searching and does not necessarily mean to understand. A perspective that is constantly questioning itself, that devoted itself to volatility and tries to grasp situations that pass by and still remain as erring memories. The result is an impressive travel report in fragments, in poetic snapshots of constantly changing perspective angles.














LESCHEK'S FLUG




OLD SONGS -NEW SONGS

For her free, expressive drawings, Nina Kaun has chosen a technique commonly used for screen printing in which ink, wax pencils and acrylic paint are used to paint directly onto transparencies. Lines and white areas are then scratched out of the black areas again. In multilayered drawings and a double perspective she creates a world, where brutality and poetry are close together.







Nick Edwards


Are you having a bad day? Well, Ob's is probably worse. The round-headed and very unfortunate hero of Nick Edwards' comic IT HAD TO BE YOU. can hardly set a foot outside his door without stumbling into car crashes or being ridiculed by his unsympathetic companion Eck. Ob and his friends live in a fantastic yet strangely familiar city that is scattered over an island landscape. Everything is round, squishy and cute, from the houses to the cars and sea animals. But do not be fooled by appearances. Unlike much of Edwards's previous work, IT HAD TO BE YOU is not suitable for children. Beneath its soft surface lies a dark and witty satire

of modern life. Yes, technology may have advanced, leading to such curious devices as toilets with integrated stool analysis computers. But the characters of Ob's world have about as much empathy for one another as a bulldozer for an overturned tree. It's dark comedy at its best.


